For those who were paying attention during Rosh Chodesh bentching, you would have noticed that the name מרחשון. One explanation given for the מר (which means bitter) addition is that leaving ימים טובים - a month full of ימים טובים - and entering into ימים טובים - which is bare of any ימים טובים - leaves one with a bitter taste.

There is another beautiful explanation given by the חידושי that שפתיו מרחשין can be understood as שפתיו מרחשין - whispering lips. We have spent so many hours davening over the past 6 weeks during a time that 'ה set aside especially for connection with Him. We have hopefully reached new levels in our אלול .רוחניות are not just extra time spent in shul! They are actually a time to recharge our batteries back to 100%. Now that we are

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THOUGHTS on the PARSHA

'ה tells Avraham in this week's parsha to leave his homeland and promises him a tremendous and unprecedented reward if he does - וְהְיֵה בְּרָכָה - and you will be a blessing. The Ramban has two explanations for these words. The first is that when a person would bless someone else, he would say, "'ה should make you like Avraham." The second explanation is that all the families of the world will be blessed on his account, as in, he will be a conduit of blessing to the world.

The Ramban has a question on this. Why is Avraham being rewarded for simply leaving a place? ה' didn't even tell him that he had to do anything when he got there to earn the reward. So how did Avraham earn this reward of והיה ברכה?

The Ramban explains that there was a story in Avraham's life that the Torah does not write, but by understanding this story we can understand the reward 'ה promised him. Avraham was originally in אור כשדים, where he rejected the avodah zara around him and chose to devote himself to serving 'ה. He was persecuted terribly for this and had to flee. He headed to נען but settled in וחרן instead.

When R' Yisroel's wife bought a lottery ticket, R' Yisroel immediately summoned two witnesses and said to her in their presence, "I have nothing to do with your money or any interest that accrues on it

ever." Why? R' Yisroel was afraid his wife might win the lottery and become rich. "When Hashem grants a person wealth," explained R' Yisroel "it is not solely for that man's benefit. It makes him a gabbai in charge of dispensing tzedakah and helping the poor. Who can accept such a heavy rsponsibility? It requires searching every

end of the city to see whether someplace there is a pauper in distress, or a sick person who needs help, or a small child whose family lacks the money to hire a teacher for him. Who can find them all?" Not wanting to face the test of wealth, R' Yisroel hastened to free himself of any rights to the lottery.
